Introducing Ourselves

With the turn of the 20th century, DAV College Jalandhar has completed eighty three years of its fruitful services in providing higher education. With over 3000 students and more than 200 faculty members, it is the largest Arts, Science & Commerce college of Punjab and imparts Post-graduate education in twelve disciplines including Chemistry, Physics, Commerce, Mathematics and Management. It was founded in 1918 with Pt. Mehar ChandJi as its founder (former) Principal. During the eighty two years of its life, this College has grown into a mighty educational centre of higher learning and occupies a position of prestige and prominence equal to that of any other institution in the country.

13. Improvement in the Library Services:

The college has a well-equipped library catering to the academic needs of the staff and students. It provides excellent reading facilities to the students and the staff. The library has an open-access system. Total number of volumes in thelibrary as per Accessing Register by now is 124729. As many as 1159 volumes have been added this year costing Rs. 2,70,299/-.

This year, 120 needy students were given sets of text books. There are more than 400 seats in the vast reading halls of the library, which remain occupied by the students throughout the day. Library service has been extended upto 7.00 pm. The college is in the process of computerising the library record.
